Dates conducted: 11/23/2019-2/9/2020

School Demographics: 185 families, 299 students

Responses: 48 or 26% of families assuming only one person per family filled out survey

(100%) Children gaining islamic knowledge (75.1%) Community engagement


(37.5%) Believe in the sunday school's vision

1. Rate how well you understand the role of the PTO: Scale of 1-5 with 1 being "Not at All" and 5 being "Very Well"






- 2. What can the PTO do to improve your and/or your child's experience at the school?

 - when are the regular meetings?



Learning is of course very important but they should also learn how to be good Muslims in today's world. I feel some of the teachers are too strict with the children and it makes children not want to go. I know many parents that have stopped sending their children because if this reason. Kids should not be upset going to Sunday school but rather they should look forward to going and seeing their friends.
 - Revise curriculum, do board standardized exams in 5th & 10th where passing the board exam would be a requirement for graduation (this at least give one purpose for the standardized exam, as currently we don't do anything with the exam besides grade them. PTSC doesn't do anything with the data. Making it a graduation requirement will provide at least one solid purpose for the exam). 4th graders are too young to take such an exam. & even if we do it in 5th grade, it needs to be somewhat watered down from its current format. 5th grade is a mid-point over the span of the Sunday school, so that makes some sense.
 - The teacher communication for parents in terms of replying email.
 Also plz use the assigned colored folders for sending classwork to home. I see my child's backpack has tons of classwork and homework papers, dont know which subject they belong to and the colored folders are usually empty. Please Advise teachers to mention in the class which folder children suppose to put that particular class's classwork. Hope to see improvement. Thank you
